That is, his speech should be absolutely clear and correct, the pronunciation should be perfect, since students will constantly repeat exactly after the teacher. The ideal option for a direct method of teaching would be to make the teacher a native English speaker. The method of grammatical translation the method of grammatical translation is the main one in the modern education system. This is a classic method that has been used for several decades. Its such prevalence is due to the fact that most teachers themselves were trained by this method. The purpose of the grammatical translation method is to learn to read and translate using grammatical rules. The disadvantages of this method include the fact that not enough attention is paid to the lexical part. The study of vocabulary is reduced to the mechanical memorization of words. Reading and translation are carried out in strict order. In addition, the texts offered for reading usually relate to complex fiction, therefore, the student studies only the literary language. Once in a language environment, it will be very difficult for him to understand others, even with a good knowledge of the literary language. Audiovisual and audio language methods. The essence of both methods is to convey the language using clear structures, memorization occurs using audio and video recordings. The audiovisual teaching method involves illustrating speech with appropriate pictures, that is, students are shown videos, feature films and documentaries in English. In this case, the trainees simultaneously have two channels of perception, visual and auditory, as a result of which associations arise in the minds of students, which allows them to better memorize the language. The purpose of these methods is to master a living, spoken language. Both methods are based on induction learning goes from rule to example. Considering all of the above, it can be noted that for university students who do not specialize in language learning, audio-lingual and audiovisual methods are suitable only if they are used in combination with other educational programs. The communicative method. Currently, more and more teachers are turning to the communicative method of learning English. The object of this method is speech itself, that is, such a technique primarily teaches communication. The communicative method assumes a great activity of students. The task of the teacher in this case will be to involve everyone in the class in the conversation. For better memorization and use of the language, it is necessary to download all the channels of perception. The essence of the communicative method is to create real communication situations. When recreating the dialogue, the student has the opportunity to put into practice all the knowledge gained. A very important advantage of the communicative method is that it has a huge variety of exercises: role-playing games, dialogues, imitation of real communication are used here.

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
